

Altar Servers/Acolytes

The server or acolyte is one who serves the presider and/or deacon; in this, ultimately, he or she serves the whole community. By assuring that the liturgy unfolds with grace and facility, the acolyte or server promotes the dynamic of the rite. The acolyte/server is unobtrusive during ministry in order that there is no diversion from the central action.

Characteristics of the Spirituality of the Altar Server/Acolyte

- Servant
- Observant and aware
- Quiet, unobtrusive demeanor
- Other-centered
- Ceremony with grace and ease
- Knowledgeable about ritual and its demands
- Purposeful
- Listener
- Becomes part of the prayer
