As *liturgical* assembly, it is the instrument for making present the Paschal Mystery and for Christ's ongoing work of salvation. When we gather as liturgical assembly, we call to mind and live out our baptismal identity.

- All focus on common identity united under Christ as Head
- Real commitment to celebrating "good" liturgy
- Balances liturgical and devotional prayer
- Ministry is *being*
